Minutes of the sitting held under the Chairmanship of Shri Ananta Nayak, Hon'ble Member, NCST, in the matter of issuance of Pattadar Passbooks for evacuee land to the petitioners.

Date of the sitting: 15.03.2023 at 11:00 a.m.

In the present case, the petitioner submitted that 300 families have been living in Hanumathanda, Ganiyanthanda, Laxmathanda, Chandiyathanda and Kishtaiahbanjar in the Kalluru revenue division, Kalluru Mandal, Khammam district. since 1968. All these families maintain their livelihood by farming on the cultivable land to the extent of 275 acres in five hamlets. After the partition, the then Zamindars Mr Abdul Haleem and Mr Abdul Hakeem migrated to Pakistan. Since then the said land had been entered into revenue records and in the column of Pattedar, it was mentioned as Custodian. The same land had been bought by the ST Lambadas in 1968 from Md. Abdul Haleem s/o Md. Ibraheem. The tribal man Banthou Hussian, s/o- Raja bought three acres of land for rupee 240 at the price of 80/per acre and got a Saada sale deed. Another tribal man Banthou Gobiriya, S/o- Ramu bought 8 acres of rupee 640 in the same manner. Since then this land has been mentioned as a custodian land in the column of possessors who have been enjoying it for more than 80 years. In this situation, the affected tribals requested the Commission that Pattadar Passbook be issued in their favour for the said land so that they can also avail benefits under the Rythu Bandhu Scheme.


A sitting was held on 05.07.2022 wherein the Resident Commissioner, Telangana and The District Collector, Khammam assured the Commission to comply the Recommendations of the Commission.

Subsequently, on 03.10.2022, a reply by The District Collector, Khammam was received wherein he provided data related to the land in possession of STs but it did not show how many petitioners have been given e-patta passbooks. He submitted that "*the then District Collector, Khammam has submitted proposals to the government for issue of necessary instructions to issue ePPBs to the eligible Ryoths. The instructions from the government are yet to be received, soon after receipt of the orders from the Government, the action will be taken accordingly.*"

The commission carefully considered the reply submitted by the State and found the same highly unsatisfactory. Therefore, Summons were issued to the District Collector, Khammam, Telangana to appear for hearing on 15.03.2023.

During the hearing the District Collector, Khammam, informed the Commission that there is no further development in the matter so far. He further stated that no proposal has been sent to the Ministry of Home Affairs and no views have been sought from MHA in this regard. The District Collector submitted that since it is evacuee property, permission of the government of India is needed to allot the land.

Challenging the submissions made by the District Collector, the petitioner stated that a piece out of the said category of land has already been allotted to a non-ST person.
